Dog friendly beaches

Berrow Beach, Brean Beach & Brean Down

(approx 25 miles)

Dogs are permitted at all times of the year on these sandy beaches. At Brean Beach and Brean Down, it's possible to park your car directly on the sand - a great place for you and your dog to run free!

Please take care at low tide.



The Countyside Code and your dog

The countryside is a great place to exercise dogs, but it's every owner's duty to make sure their dog is not a danger or nuisance to farm animals, wildlife or other people.

- By law, you must control your dog so that it does not disturb or scare farm animals or wildlife. You must keep your dog on a short lead on most areas of open country and common land between 1 March and 31 July, and at all times near farm animals.
- You do not have to put your dog on a lead on public paths as long as it is under close control. But as a general rule, keep your dog on a lead if you cannot rely on its obedience. By law, farmers are entitled to destroy a dog that injures or worries their animals.
- If a farm animal chases you and your dog, it is safer to let your dog off the lead - don't risk getting hurt by trying to protect it.
- Take particular care that your dog doesn't scare sheep and lambs or wander where it might disturb birds that nest on the ground and other wildlife – eggs and young will soon die without protection from their parents.
- Everyone knows how unpleasant dog mess is and it can cause infections

 so always clean up after your dog and get rid of the mess responsibly.

 Also make sure your dog is wormed regularly to protect it, other animals and people.
- At certain times dogs may not be allowed on some areas of open land or may need to be kept on a lead. Please follow any signs.

IMPORTANT - please read our dog rules (boring but essential to ensure a peaceful and pleasant stay for all guests)

Dogs must be on short, **nonextendable** leads around the park and must not be permitted to stray onto other guests' pitches

Dogs must be kept on a lead at all times (including on your pitch or at your accommodation), except when in the designated dog exercise areas.

Dogs that cause excessive noise, display aggressive behaviour or prove to be uncontrollable are not welcome guests at our tranquil park.

Only leave your dog unattended on your pitch/accommodation, when you leave the park, if you are positive that your dog will not become distressed or cause problems for other guests.

It's worth remembering, some people are nervous around dogs and also that many dogs can be anxious around others, so do please check with owners before allowing your pet to approach others.



Owners who neglect cleaning up after their pets will be reminded of their obligations to our other guests and to the park and may be asked to leave.

7 dog waste bins are provided for your convenience and are situated around the park. Please, please use them.

We do reserve the right to refuse customers or ask them to leave, should the behaviour of their dogs disrupt the tranquility of the park and/or prove a nuisance to other guests.

If the enjoyment of your stay at Old Oaks is impeded by another's pet, please do inform a member of the reception team, who will do their best to help resolve any issues. However, please note that whilst we try to do as much as we can to encourage guests to follow our rules and be responsible and respectful to others, we do not take responsibility for any incidents involving dogs which may occur on the park, that are caused by the negligence of other guests.
